The ideas on the grid below are linked to our topic newsletter. Here are some activities you could do for the project. We would like the children to follow their interests and be as creative as they like, so these are simply ideas and the possibilities are extensive.

Make a shoebox scene from a story (e.g. forest, castle).	Think of a meal or snack you enjoy making at home. Can you make some instructions so our class bear can try it? Create a family tree of a royal family (real or made up).  Write/draw a "Day in the life of a king/queen".	Draw and label a church.  Design your own stained glass window. Can you practise being arty at home? Create any piece of artwork which is special to you and share it with us in school.
