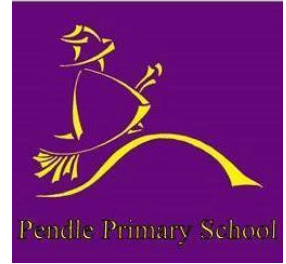

### Spring Term Curriculum

This term, in English, the children will be reading the novel *Who Let the Gods Out* and exploring Greek myths. In Maths, we will continue with the Red Rose scheme, focusing on developing problem-solving and reasoning skills.

Our History topic will be the Ancient Greeks, where pupils will learn about their culture, achievements and influence on modern society. In Geography, we will investigate the question: *Would you like to live in the desert?*—exploring climate, human adaptation and physical features.

In Design and Technology, the focus will be on frame structures, allowing pupils to design and build their own models. Art lessons will concentrate on drawing and expressing ideas creatively.

In Science, we will study space and Earth, looking at planets, the solar system and how our planet fits into the wider universe. For Religious Education, the topic will be Christianity, examining beliefs, practices, and their significance.
